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



THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

P. Holy are you, O Lord, and great is your majesty. All the saints in heaven and on earth sing their praise of your eternal glory.

For in the beginning, you prepared the world by your holy Word, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible. You laid out your holy plan of creation and redemption, that all who might know you would have faith, not in things seen, but in things not seen.

By faith, the patriarchs dared to hope in the promise of your love and care. By faith, the prophets revealed your word of the blessing that was to come. By faith, your chosen people waited in longing for that blessing, until, in the fullness of time, you sent your only Son, born in the flesh from one whose faith was not in vain. 
